Are you registered to Vote?

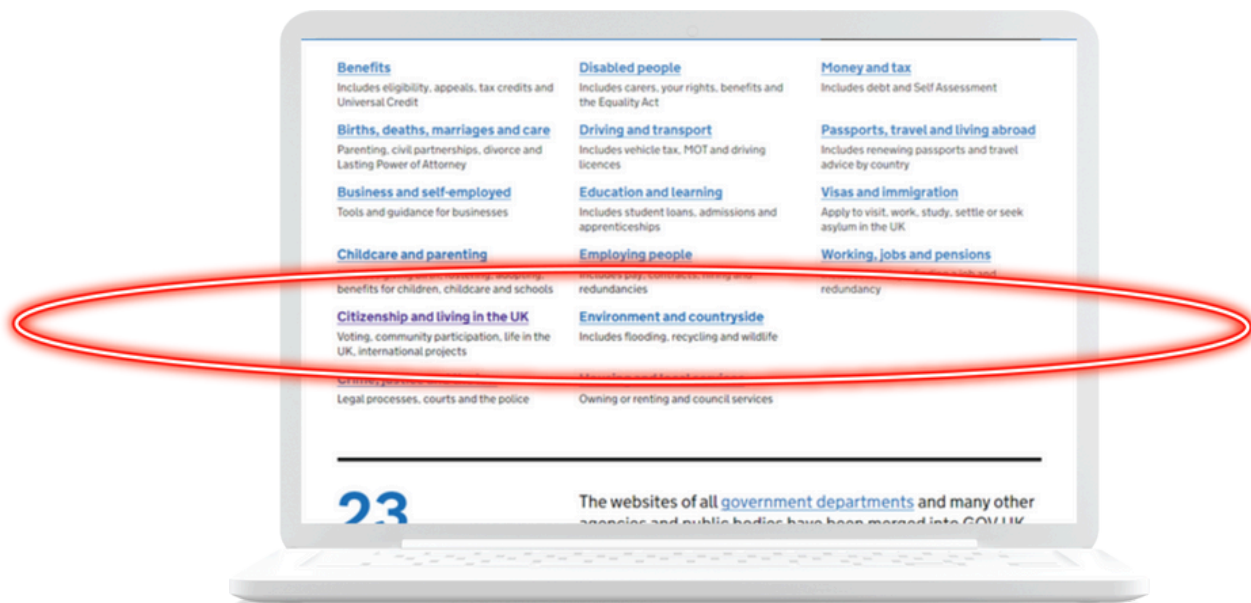
It couldn't be easier. Here's how.

You will need to go online. Find a computer, tablet or mobile phone. Use your library or borrow from a friend.

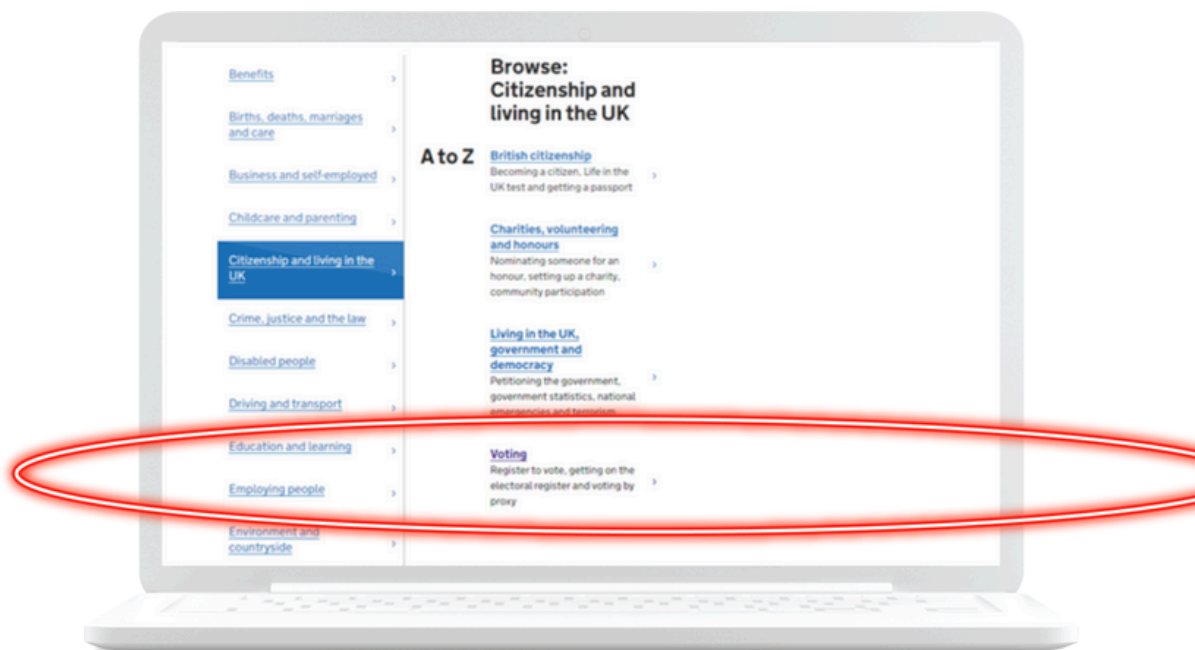
Go to www.gov.uk



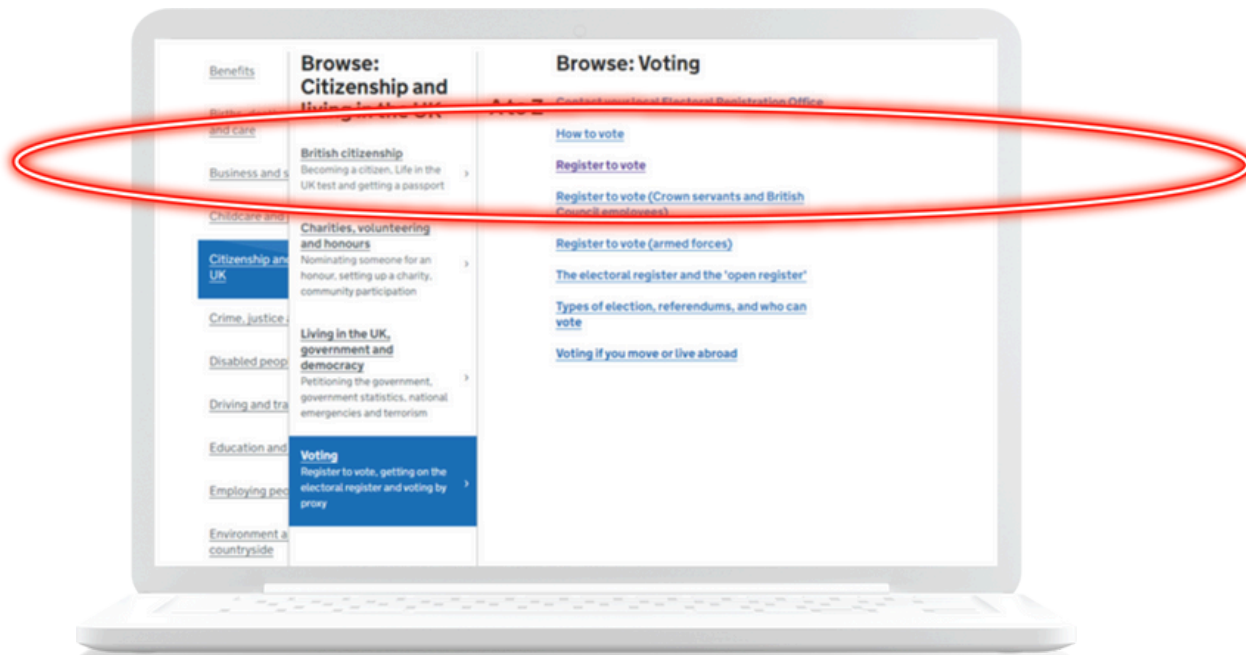
Scroll down the page until you can see 'Citizenship and living in the UK'



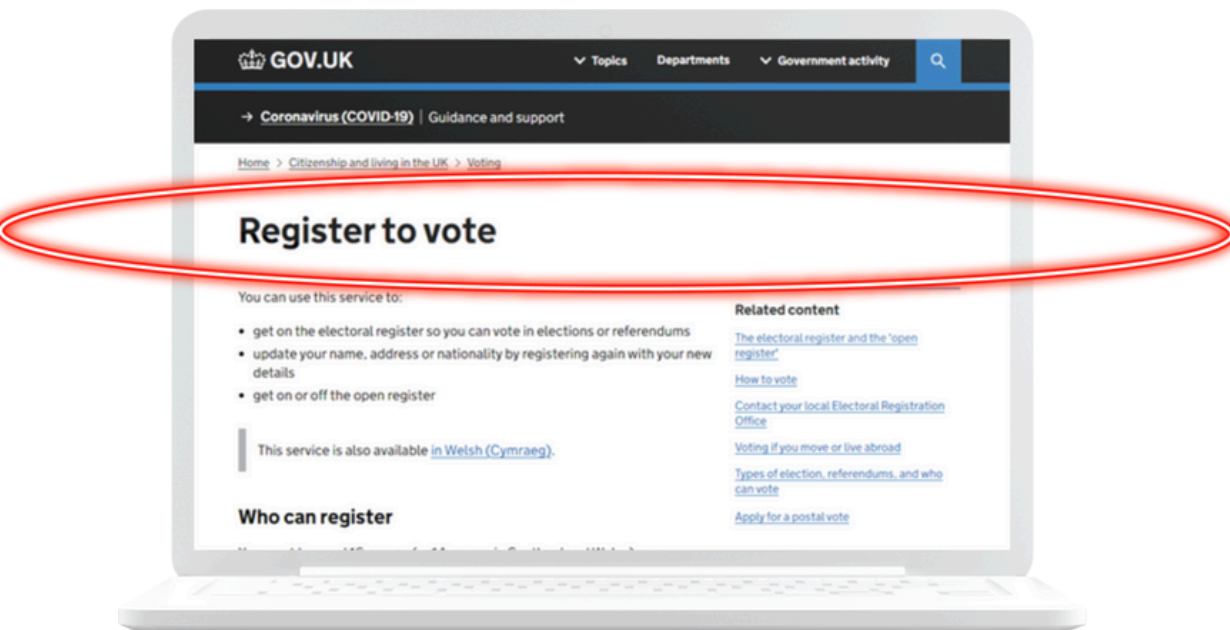
Click on 'citizenship and living in the UK'



Click on 'voting'

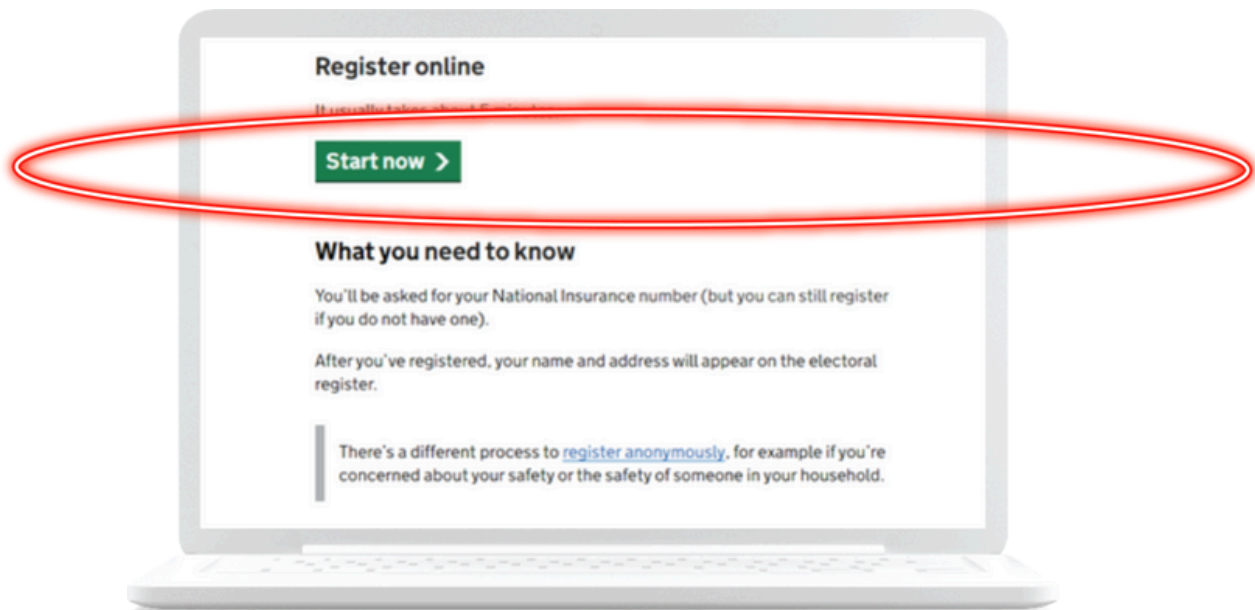


Click on 'register to vote'



Register to Vote

Scroll down to the Register Online Section



Click on the START NOW button.

You will need your National Insurance number and a address you can register.

Fill in the form. It'll take about 5 minutes.

Registering to vote couldn't be simpler, but around 17% of the UK population doesn't bother. Many fail to do so because they feel politics is nothing to do with them – or that all politicians are the same. Yet by failing to register – and therefore denying themselves the right to vote – these people are ensuring they have no say in decisions made on their behalf. Democracy is a verb you have to show up!

Young people – 18 to 24-year-olds – and BEM voters are the least likely to vote. Only 47% of 18 to 24-year-olds voted in the 2019 General Election. 25 per cent of Black voters in Great Britain, 24 per cent of Asian voters and almost a third (31%) of eligible people with mixed ethnicity are not registered.

We're encouraging all those who are not yet registered to do so. Your vote is your voice – make sure you are heard.
